

## SCHEDULE OF RATES

The following rates and fees are established pursuant to various policies of the Division:

A. Fees

1. Bus Passes: (effective September 1, 1997)

- a) \$250.00 per year or \$25.00 per month for ineligible passengers as defined by Divisional policy.
- b) \$250.00 per year or \$25.00 per month for students in Early Childhood Services as defined by Divisional policy.
- c) A family rate of \$600.00 is established for families in 1(a) and (b) above.
- d) \$120.00 per year or

\$15.00 per month surcharge for ECS students that desire noon hour transportation (subject to 14 students minimum in one community).

2. Bus Rental Rates:

- a) For non school rentals \$0.91 per kilometer return trip (if no bus is available at the point of starting of the trip, then mileage shall be charged from the regular location of the bus used).
- b) For school rentals \$0.72 per kilometer return trip (if no bus is available at the point of starting of the trip, then mileage shall be charged from the regular location of the bus used).
- c) In addition to the mileage rate, there shall be an hourly rate charged equal to the actual driver's salary cost. calculated from the time the bus is called for until it is returned.
- d) A minimum of \$52.50 per bus shall be charged for each use. The above charges shall cover the costs of the driver's wages, gasoline, extra insurance and all routine maintenance expenses for non-school uses.
- e) Subject to 2(c) immediately above, when a bus rental has been scheduled and subsequently cancelled and notice of the cancellation has not been given to the Transportation Office or the bus driver the following will apply:
  - i) Where the bus driver has arranged for a spare driver to complete his/her regular bus route because the bus rental was to occur during that same time period, a charge equal to the amount of the bus driver's regular route (1/199 of annual salary or portion thereof) shall be made plus any costs related to mileage.

- ii) Where the bus driver was not required to make arrangements for his/her regular bus route, a charge equal to the minimum as set out in 2(c) immediately above.

Notwithstanding the foregoing:

- a) Set up time for rented facilities, requiring the presence of the caretaker in addition to normal duties: \$20.00 per hour.
- b) Set up time for video conferencing, requiring the presence of the caretaker in addition to normal duties: \$20.00 per hour, to a maximum of two (2) hours if required. Technology Services technician on-call or on-site is charged at the hourly rate set by that department.
- c) Home Economics room: \$35.00 per hour
- d) Industrial Arts areas: \$35.00 per hour
- e) Computer Laboratory: Room Rental \$20.00 (Maintenance Rev.)  
Computer Rental \$25.00 (School Rev.)  
In cases b) and c) and d), rental of the facility is conditional upon the area being supervised by an instructor or other person acceptable to the Superintendent of Schools.
- f) Facilities used under a joint use agreement to which the Board is party - rate per category 3.
- g) Church groups wishing to use a facility on a regular basis may do so for a term of up to two years. The rate category no. 3 will apply.

8. Rental of Audio Visual Equipment:

Items may be considered and rental rates will be established by the Secretary-Treasurer.

9. Rental of Tables and Chairs:

\$1.25 per chair  
\$5.50 per table

10. Personal transportation fee for adult education students:

\$590/year or \$70/month

11. Searches for student records or registers of students that have graduated or left Peace River School Division:

\$60.00 for the first hour and \$30.00 per hour for each additional hour.

12. Refundable damage deposit for full time Virtual Education students:

Where a student on a virtual education program requires and receives a computer for their home use in the program, the computer will not be provided until a refundable damage deposit has been provided to Peace River School Division. When the computer is returned to Peace River School Division, the damage deposit will be refunded, less any costs related to the repair of damage to the computer.

Damage Deposit: \$100.00

13. Wireless One-On-One Project:

Where a student requires and receives a computer *for their home use* in the program, the computer will not be provided until the below deposit and fee has been provided to Peace River School Division. When the computer is returned to Peace River School Division, the damage deposit will be refunded, less any costs related to the repair of damage to the computer excluding regular wear.

(Refundable) Damage Deposit: \$100.00

(Non-Refundable) Laptop Maintenance Fee: \$50.00

*(provides for the on-going cleaning, maintenance and use of laptops)*

14. Sale of Psychology Services to other jurisdictions, institutions or individuals:

\$120.00 per hour.

B. Reimbursement Rates:

1. Travel Allowance

Maximum of \$0.45 per kilometer (Schools may choose to pay a lesser rate) effective August 1, 2007.:

Receipted hotel accommodation

\$10.00 - Breakfast

\$13.00 – Lunch

\$22.00 - Supper

\$20.00 per night for accommodation in lieu of hotel charges

2. Bus Storage:

\$42.00 per month for bus drivers using their own electricity for dual bus block heaters.

\$13.25 per month for bus drivers who do not have electrical power available but provide a garage which the bus is housed.

3. Bus Washing:

\$13.25/month

4. Reimbursement for transportation of special needs pupil by private vehicle provided by employee:

\$0.45 per kilometer; daily minimum payment \$6.00 (effective August 1, 2007).

5. Boarding and conveyance allowance for students attending another jurisdiction as per Alberta Education Regulation.

6. Home School Program Reimbursement for Expenditures Rates:

ADLC Programs:

- Elementary/Jr. High Students: \$1145.00

- Sr. High Students: \$1463.00

This reimbursement includes the cost of the ADLC correspondence courses paid by the Division.

Non ADLC Programs:

- Elementary Students: \$1145.00
- Jr./Sr. High Students: \$1145.00

If a student is enrolled as a part time home school student and a part time in school student, the reimbursement allocation will be prorated based on the percentage of time spent on the home school program. All reimbursements are subject to limitations placed by provincial legislation and regulation and school division policy.

7. Substitute school bus driver initial appointment license upgrading: \$70.00
