Grade Eleven and Twelve Open Campus Privileges

Grade eleven and twelve students are accorded a number of privileges designed to celebrate their status as senior high students at Worsley Central School. With privilege comes the responsibility that the privilege will not be abused.

One of the privileges available to Grade eleven and twelve students is that of Open Campus during lunch break (11:48-12:37), and spares. Students are not permitted to leave during scheduled classes or Distance Learning time unless daily permission from a parent is given to do so.

If parents have given their permission, students are allowed to leave the school grounds during the lunch break and spare(s), provided the following conditions have been met.

- a) The student accepts responsibility for punctuality, realizing that the first class after the lunch break begins at 12:37, so the student should be back at school by the warning buzzer, which is at **12:32**. Students leaving for spares shall be back in the school in time for their next scheduled class.
- b) The student shall not leave if a staff member has requested that he stay on school property to serve a detention or make up work etc.
- c) High caffeine booster drinks are not allowed in school or on school grounds.**
- d) The student must sign out and then sign in again each time he/she leaves the building.**

By signing the form, the parent realizes that their child in Grade eleven or twelve may sign out on any or all days for the remainder of the school year. If parents choose not to sign this form, their child will require a note for each and every instance that their child plans on leaving the school grounds.
